As a neutral country, Switzerland came out of World War II unharmed. Who are the Holocaust survivors in Switzerland? The vast majority were not Swiss citizens at the time. They came from the German Reich or other European countries; and as Jews, they were a direct target of Nazi persecution. Some survived concentration camps and extermination camps; others saved themselves by escaping or hiding. Most arrived in Switzerland after World War II.

In 2017/18, Switzerland held the Chairmanship of the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance. The exhibition 'The Last Swiss Holocaust Survivors' gives a say to the last witnesses of the Holocaust and their descendants.

The exhibition in Sweden is collaboration between the Gamaraal Foundation, the Swedish Holocaust Museum and Paideia - The European Institute for Jewish Studies in Sweden with support from the Embassy of Switzerland in Sweden. The event is in English. Free entrance.

"The Last Swiss Holocaust Survivors" is a project of the Gamaraal Foundation, a Swiss foundation founded in 2014. The foundation supports Holocaust survivors and is engaged in the field of Holocaust education.

"The exhibition 'The Last Swiss Holocaust Survivors' demonstrates through biographies and portraits what can result from anti-Semitism, which is newly ascendant in several countries.
